### Arizona Geological Survey Update



Earth fissure closes W. Houston Rd, Pinal County. On Monday, 26 July, in the wake of torrential monsoon rains, an earth fissure forced the closing of W. Houston Rd and damaged a nearby industrial site just 3 miles southwest of Apache Junction in Pinal County. According to Joe Cook, AZGS earth fissure project manager, earth fissures first appeared in this area in 1976. Fissuring became increasingly problematic, as new fissures formed into the mid-1980s. The event was the result of reactivation of a pre-existing fissure.


